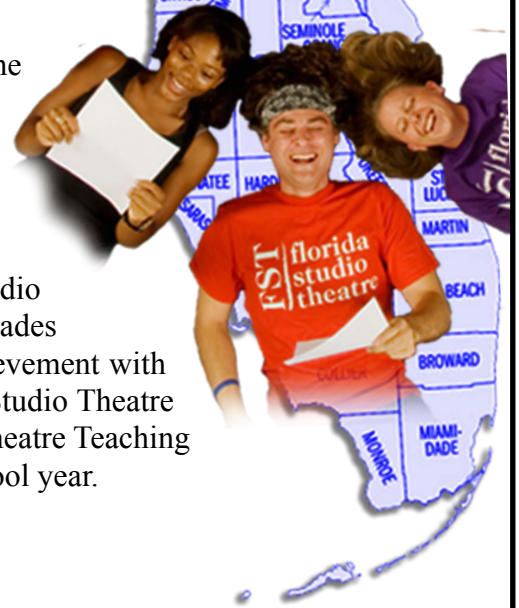


Playwriting Workshop Tour As little as \$4 per student! *Begins December 2011*

Florida Studio Theatre offers professional, in-class workshops as either a one day or a three day residency. Our professional teaching artists use FST's proven teaching method to motivate your students to exercise their writing skills. By reinforcing techniques you already use in the classroom, FST can be your ally in the battle for quality creative writing.

Upon completion, plays and sketches can be submitted to Florida Studio Theatre's annual Young Playwrights Festival – a contest that is open to grades K-12. Every student will be recognized for their participation and achievement with a personalized certificate. Winning writers will be honored by Florida Studio Theatre in the spring. Teachers may also continue to utilize the Florida Studio Theatre Teaching Artists as consultants and resources throughout the remainder of the school year.

PLAYWRITING WORKSHOPS:

Student Plays Performed by Students

Short Sketches for the Stage or Screen

Sketch Comedy is a type of performance most recognizable in well-known television shows such as Saturday Night Live, MADtv, Whose Line Is It Anyway?, and Kids in the Hall. It is also a popular and fun form of live theatre that will excite your students and inspire them to write!

SCREENWRITING WORKSHOP:

Short Screenplay for Film or Television

3 Day Workshop Residency:

Day 1 (1 hour)

Playwriting: Students will learn the elements of playwriting. Students will see an example of a student-written play performed live in their classroom by FST teaching artists. Together, students and teaching artists will brainstorm and improvise ideas which may be incorporated into a short class play..

Sketch Comedy: Students will learn the fundamentals of improvisation and short scenes using fun, high-energy theatre games designed to inspire creativity. Students will learn the elements and structure of sketch comedy. They will also be advised on how to develop punchlines, incorporate pop culture references, write spoofs, parodies, satires and more! Students, individually or in a small group, will complete the first draft of a 2-minute play or sketch.

Screenwriting: Students learn the fundamentals of writing for film or television. They will explore format, style and genre.

Day 2 (1 hour)

Under the guidance of FST teaching artists, students will work with a partner to edit and revise the first draft of their play or sketch. Students will finalize their 2-minute play or sketch. Students will get the opportunity to “cast” their plays or sketches by choosing classmates who will serve as actors and assist them in the reading of their play or sketch on Day 3.

Day 3 (1 hour)

Under the guidance of FST teaching artists, the student actors will perform readings of 2-minute plays/sketches for the class. Students will receive final comments and suggestions on how to improve their play or sketch prior to submission to the Young Playwrights Festival.

Single Day Residency:

Four introductory in-class workshops that include the material covered in Day 1 of playwriting, sketch-comedy or screenwriting residency. Workshops are designed for 25 students per class and run 1 hour in length. Students will receive final comments and suggestions on how to improve their play, sketch or screenplay prior to submission to the Young Playwrights Festival. One teacher training workshop is geared to empower your fellow teachers and give you the tools necessary to establish a creative classroom.

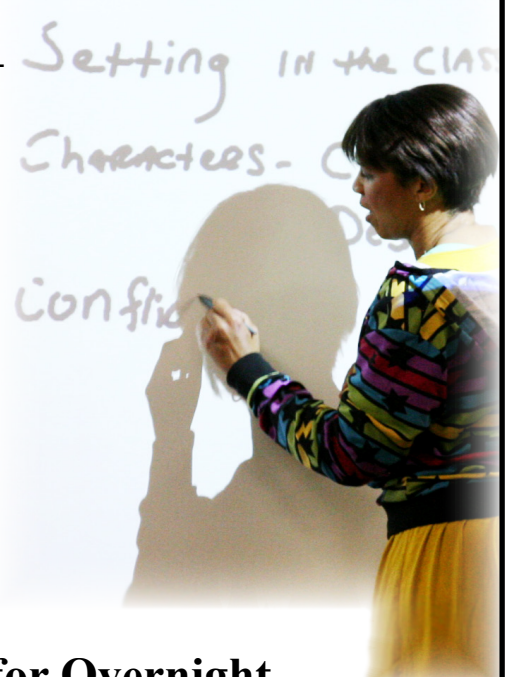
